Who is Hussain Alasfour

Hussain Alasfour is a prominent legal figure in Kuwait and the founder of the Alasfour Law Group for Advocacy and Legal Consultations. He is qualified to appear before the Court of Cassation and the Constitutional Court, possessing extensive experience across various legal domains, including criminal, commercial, civil, and administrative law. Alasfour is known for his successful track record in securing acquittals for his clients in complex cases, such as those involving embezzlement, forgery, and misappropriation of public funds, which has earned him a strong reputation within the Kuwaiti legal community. Beyond his legal practice, Alasfour is active in public affairs and sports law. He previously served as the Vice President of the Law Society, reflecting his standing among his peers. In 2017, he was appointed as the legal advisor to the Asian Sports Press Union, tasked with providing legal counsel and protecting the union's rights. Alasfour frequently appears in the media to comment on high-profile legal issues, such as money laundering cases and other matters of public interest, offering his expert legal analysis. He also takes a keen interest in educational rights, having successfully sued the Ministry of Higher Education to ensure his ability to complete his master's degree, winning a final judgment in 2022.

Achievements of Hussain Alasfour

In 2017, Hussain Alasfour was appointed as the legal advisor to the Asian Sports Press Union. Through this role, his law firm became the official legal representative for the union, responsible for providing all necessary legal consultations and protecting its rights at continental and international levels. Alasfour has achieved significant judicial victories, including securing an acquittal for expatriates accused of seizure, forgery, and damaging the funds of a major cooperative society. His defense before the Criminal Court of Appeals was based on the invalidity of the investigations and the absence of the elements of the crime, a position the court upheld following an expert's report. He has successfully litigated numerous complex criminal cases, including one where a public official was accused of embezzling violation records. Alasfour convinced the criminal court to acquit his client by arguing that the essential elements of the crime were not met and that personal disputes existed between his client and the accuser, leading to a verdict of not guilty. In the administrative law sphere, Alasfour won a landmark case against the Ministry of Higher Education in June 2022. The Administrative Court ordered the ministry to overturn its previous decision refusing to allow him to complete his master's degree at Ain Shams

University in Egypt, affirming his right to enroll and pursue his postgraduate studies.
