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Who is Latefa Alyahyouth

Latefa Alyahyouth is a licensed Kuwaiti lawyer practicing in Kuwait City, who has established herself as a specialized legal voice in personal status and family law. In a notable appearance on the 'Albesat Ahmadi' podcast, she provided a comprehensive analysis of the challenges facing modern families in Kuwaiti society. She discussed the economic and social dimensions of divorce and how the legal framework addresses these evolving dynamics. She is known for her approach that combines rigorous legal analysis with a strong understanding of social realities, enabling her to provide effective counsel and represent her clients proficiently in court.

Achievements of Latefa Alyahyouth

Latefa Alyahyouth achieved a notable legal victory in a complex family law case, where she successfully represented her client to recover dowry jewelry (shabka) valued at 66,000 Kuwaiti Dinars following a broken engagement. Her defense was built on proving that the marriage was never consummated due to the other party's misconduct, leading to a court ruling compelling the defendant to return the jewelry or its equivalent value. In another case highlighting her skill in criminal law, Alyahyouth secured an acquittal for a telecommunications company employee accused of forging a customer's contract. During the proceedings, she successfully argued the employee's good faith and adherence to all required company procedures, demonstrating that he was deceived by the impersonator. The court accepted her defense and acquitted her client of the forgery charges.

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
