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Who is Maya Hussein

Maya Hussein is a Lebanese-Canadian comedian, content creator, and social media influencer known for her satirical skits depicting daily life in Arab households. Born and raised in London, Ontario, to Lebanese parents from Aita al-Fokhar in the Beqaa Valley, she leverages her upbringing in a large Arab family to create relatable and humorous content. Before her rise to fame, Hussein worked as a kindergarten teacher for seven years. Her journey into content creation began in April 2020 during the COVID-19 lockdown, when she noticed a lack of Arabic-centric comedy on TikTok and decided to fill the void. Her first video went viral, gaining over two million views overnight and launching her new career. Hussein's content, which she shares across TikTok, Instagram, and YouTube, resonates with audiences worldwide by humorously highlighting cultural nuances and family dynamics. She aims to preserve and celebrate Arab culture and language, adding English captions to make her videos accessible to a broader audience. Beyond comedy, she has openly discussed her personal experience with divorce to challenge the stigma within the Arab community and uses her platform for philanthropic efforts.

Achievements of Maya Hussein

Maya Hussein has achieved significant viral success, with many of her videos garnering millions of views. A notable TikTok video posted on November 30, 2021, surpassed 7.8 million views, showcasing her widespread appeal and ability to create highly engaging content. Expanding her career from social media to live performance, Hussein performed her first stand-up comedy show in Toronto in June 2023. This marked a major milestone, successfully transitioning her comedic talent to a live stage and receiving a positive reception from a large audience. Hussein is also actively involved in philanthropy. She has collaborated with the non-profit organization Project Ummah Relief on humanitarian missions in Kenya. Through her platform, she helped raise funds and traveled to Wajir, Kenya, twice, supporting 205 cataract surgeries for patients at risk of blindness and distributing food during Ramadan.

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
